On the 3rd June 2015, I visited your premises with Thames Valley Police to ensure you are complying with the above premises licence and advise on any matters that may arise during the inspection.

During our inspection, we found a number of items that require your attention as outlined below/attached.

1) Condition 2 under Annex 2 of the premises licence in relation to CCTV is not being fully complied with. The condition states that a comprehensive system must be in place and working to cover all areas of the licensed premises. Having checked the CCTV coverage it was found that a number of areas were not covered by the CCTV. This was most noticeable upstairs in the various gangways leading from the smoking terrace to the male and female toilets. A similar issue was also found downstairs in the corner of the premises leading to the disabled toilet. It was also discovered that the cameras monitoring the smoking terrace were either providing inadequate coverage or were not functioning at all. It was also not clear whether anyone working on the premises knew how the CCTV could be accessed. Whilst it is acknowledged that 62 cameras on the premises is a lot of coverage, it is not enough to provide coverage of all areas - especially if there are cameras that are not functioning. Please ensure that this is rectified straight away.

2) A further cause of concern with the lack of full CCTV coverage is the fact that drug swabbing revealed extremely high readings in the male and female toilets upstairs as well as the staff toilet. These are a major concern and indicate that there is an issue with drug taking on the premises - possibly due to the lack of CCTV coverage in these areas. CCTV needs to be installed in these areas to ensure all of the premises is covered and any illegal activity can be detected.

3) Condition 3 under Annex 2 of the premises licence in relation to a written dispersal policy is not being complied with. Whilst it is acknowledged that some methods of dispersal are taking place in the premises at the end of an evening, the policy needs to be submitted to and agreed upon by Thames Valley Police. No documentary evidence was produced during our visit to suggest that this had been done and it was confirmed verbally that it hadn't been. A premises within a Cumulative Impact Area should also be taking steps to ensure that customers emanating from it are dispersed from the area and are not adding to the cumulative effect within Friar Street. Please ensure a dispersal policy is submitted to Thames Valley Police right away.

4) Condition 5 under Annex 2 of the premises licence in relation to an incident book being kept on the premises and completed is not being complied with. The condition states that the incident book should be kept on the premises to record any incidents or refusals of alcohol. It also states that this book should be signed off weekly by the Designated Premises Supervisor or a nominated representative. Please ensure this is actioned right away.

5) Condition 1 under the heading 'Prevention of Crime and Disorder' in relation to a risk assessment being carried out for the employment of door supervisors Sunday to Thursday inclusive is not being complied with. No documentary evidence was produced to indicate this was being done and it was acknowledged verbally that it hadn't been. This is particularly important as the premises licence holder and designated premises supervisor need to ensure that events carried out on these days are properly risk assessed and appropriate door staff employed if required. Please ensure these risk assessments are carried out and documented.

6) Condition 1 under the heading 'Protection of Children from Harm' in relation to all persons who sell alcohol being trained to BIIAB Level 1 standard is not being complied with. Any person who is selling alcohol at the premises should be trained to this standard before commencing employment at the premises. Their individual training certificates should also be kept on site and produced when requested to ensure compliance. No documentary evidence was provided to suggest that any staff member had received the required training and it was confirmed verbally that not all staff had been trained to the required standard. Any staff member who has not undergone and passed the required training should not be selling alcohol. Please ensure that all relevant staff members have undergone and passed the training right away and that they bring in their certificates to demonstrate this.

7) A Section 57 notice was not in place. This tells Responsible Authorities who has custody of the premises licence and where it is located. Please ensure that this is done.

8) A list compiled by the DPS of who is authorised in his absence to sell alcohol was not in place. Please ensure this is actioned.

9) Understanding of what the Licensing Objectives were and the fact that the premises was in the Cumulative Impact Area was lacking. The Premises Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor should, as a matter of course, have knowledge of this and should be able to train their staff accordingly to take them into account during day to day operation of the premises. Please ensure you are familiar with these terms.

10) It was acknowledged that the premises makes use of 9 SIA Door Supervisors on a busy night. Given the deficiencies in the CCTV, the issues with drugs and the lack of a risk assessment, it is strongly suggested that the quantity of door staff is insufficient due to the layout of the venue. You are advised to risk assess this and make any adjustments necessary to uphold the licensing objectives - notably prevention of crime and disorder. It was also noted the the log kept by the door supervisors lacked information in terms of descriptions of individuals and actions taken to deal with issues on the premises. You are advised to ensure that the book is filled in more thoroughly. This will assist your staff in identifying any persistent trouble makers and will assist Thames Valley Police/Reading Borough Council with any investigations that may need to be carried out in relation to incidents. The door book also needs to be completed thoroughly in terms of the details of the door staff on duty.

11) You are reminded that the people legally responsible for the premises under the Licensing Act 2003 are the premises licence holder and the designated premises supervisor. It should not be the promoter or door staff deciding what goes on at the premises or who is permitted on the premises.

Please rectify all of the above points within 7 days.

All of the above should have been in place before you opened the venue. The venue has been trading in breach of it's licence right from the opening even though this is the first document that should have been complied with before you opened. It is disappointing to note that despite using very experienced licensing solicitors that a premises in the Cumulative Impact Area is trading as it is in breach of its licence.

This letter is sent and should be received as a warning against any future breaches of your premises licence. Should any future breaches occur, formal action may be considered.

I've checked on safetynet, looking at their power on times I think they are either not charging their radio properly or the battery isn't lasting the whole night. On most nights the radio is switched on and a radio check is done in the evening. Later on in the night the radio obviously turns off because it is then powered on several times this is mainly in the early hours which would indicate the battery has run out. On the 30th it looks like their battery was dead and they hadn't noticed this would probably explain why they had to switch the radio 0329 just to log off. It would appear they did do a radio check at 2143.

The only other one that does stand out within the last week is on the 4th, they switch the radio on at 0053 because they have issue. Only female bar staff on, no door staff. Aggressive male was kicking off, Kev dealt with the job it doesn't look like any arrests were made.

Any problems give me a shout.

Hi guys, hope you're well.

On PC Wheeler's advice I contacted Ian Savill at the council. He visited on Monday and has set into motion plans to arrange a days training course for our staff who either do not currently have the BIIAB Level 1 qualification, or those who are unable to prove that they have. Ian will get back to me when he has a confirmed course date available, but is aware that I would like it to take place as soon as possible. In the meantime we have put together a noticeboard with information on challenge 25, licensing objectives, signs of intoxication and other training measures related to the responsible serving of alcohol. Would you consider allowing current staff members to continue serving drinks past the 7 days previously requested with the proper training pending? I assure you that it will be completed at the earliest date Ian has available.

Also please see attached for the approval of the Thames Valley Police, our Dispersal Policy document and our Risk Assessment for Sunday-Thursday trading without door staff.

I hope you find them suitable. Please let me know if you would like me also to forward them on to anybody else.

Many thanks for your help and advice so far, and look forward to hearing back from you regarding these matters.

Dispersal Policy

I, James Spencer, OPS and General Manager of Treehouse in Reading, hereby announce my dispersal policy guidelines, to be upheld by myself, my staff and the door security company that I have employed. These guidelines will be upheld under my supervision, or under that of a trusted manager, during weekend evenings, or any other night where there is likely to be a large amount of customers with the potential to affect the Cumulative Impact Area.

1. Last entry will be no later than 1.30am. After this point customer numbers will naturally decrease in a steady flow until the end of the evening.
2. As the numbers decrease, door supervisors will start to 'close down' areas, in order to easily manage the remainder of the crowd, and free up other supervisors to assist in the safe dispersal of customers outside of the venue.
3. Our licence allows the sale by retail of alcohol until 3.00am. By 2.45am, bar staff will be encouraged to advise customers of the imminent closing of the venue, in order to prevent customers from having to drink quickly before exiting the venue.
4. Our licence allows the playing of recorded music until 3.00am. By 2.45am the DJ will be instructed to lower the volume of the music in order to advise customers that the venue will be closing shortly.
5. A door supervisor, who will always be on the smoking terrace, will allow no new customers to enter the terrace after 2.45am, effectively closing down the area in a safe and steady manner.
6. If any smaller rooms upstairs are being used, door supervisors will ensure the safe dispersal of customers by closing down the areas at a time that they deem appropriate, and allowing no new customers into these areas after 2.30am.
7. By 3.00am, the music will stop and the lights will go up in order to create better visibility and communication between customers and door staff, allowing for the safe dispersal of the remainder of the customers.
8. Once outside the venue, door supervisors and venue managers will encourage customers to leave in a safe and orderly manner, pointing them in the direction of local taxis and open food outlets outside the Cumulative Impact Area.
9. Door supervisors will stay on duty until all customers have left the building and dispersed safely from the area, and the venue manager is satisfied that their job for the evening is complete.
10. Door supervisors will be provided with the 'Echo Tango' radio in order to quickly contact local authorities should they ever require assistance.

I trust that these guidelines are clear and satisfactory, and look forward to any feedback or additional points that Thames Valley Police deem appropriate.

0230hrs 14/06/2015: Michael CRONE , a member of door staff at TREEHOUSE, FRIAR STREET, READING saw punch on the nose in TREEHOUSE, leaving a cut to the face.

CRONE attempted to grab but he escaped and ran out of the club. Officers saw being chased from TREEHOUSE up towards QUEEN VICTORIA STREET, READING by door staff. Officers gave chase and arrested at QUEEN VICTORIA STREET. Officers did not witness the alleged assault.

CRONE says he saw assault on and tried to grab immediately. When he could not detain FRASER he gave chase down FRIAR STREET, attracting attention of officers by shouting "ON ME - ASSAULT." This identified the offence and offender to Police. However, shortly after officers started chasing , CRONE stopped and returned to TREEHOUSE without giving much information to officers. Officers took CRONE's details and arranged for him to come in to give a statement but he did not show up for his appointment. TREEHOUSE staff were unwilling to produce CCTV immediately. DoB for victim indicates that he is 17 years old.

Pc 1141 MCKEND took up chase after was identified as an offender. Pc 261 ROSE and Pc 332 KAIROUZ apprehended , deployed CAPTOR and handcuffed him. Pc MCKEND then arrested at 0230hrs 14/06/2015 on suspicion of assault.

Hi Si,

As long promised, just tracked down my GEN40 from 14/06/2015 for an assault at TREEHOUSE, written on date of incident.

A victim, , was identified and gave contact details but refused to give a statement or support Police action. A member of TREEHOUSE door staff, Michael CRONE, arranged to give a statement but did not attend his appointment. TREEHOUSE were unable to produce CCTV immediately following the incident as the staff said it would take too long to create a copy. Because of this, while the suspect was arrested, there was no evidence to put to him so he gave a "NO COMMENT" interview and was bailed.

CCTV was later produced (in USB format) but did not clearly show any offences. Neither the victim nor the witness CRONE ever gave statements or returned any of my calls. The case was declared NFA on 02/07/2015.

Is this what you need or would you like me to put the whole story in a new, complete GEN40?

Police were flagged down to attend TREEHOUSE by door staff who were reporting two disorderly females refusing to leave the area of the club following them being ejected from the club. Officers attended and arrested both parties for being drunk and disorderly. Following this it was alleged that both of the arrested parties had assaulted two females in the venue prior to their ejection. Victims were debriefed and the suspects were further arrested for these offences.

Although CCTV was requested on the night TREEHOUSE it was not provided until the 12/06 having been chased on the 08/06 and 10/06. After CCTV was produced it was not able to be played on TVP computers and was submitted to VSU where it was unable to be viewed because a copy of the programme to view it was not on the USB. TREEHOUSE have been contacted on the 09/07, 14/07 and 20/07 with regards to producing this with no success.

This relates to an incident of disorder that occurred at TREEHOUSE, FRIAR STREET in the early hours of 26/07/15. I was stationed opposite TREEHOUSE for the night. I was told by the head bouncer that the promotion team had messed up and had booked VIP tables designed for 5-8 people for up to 19 persons. The queue at one point led back to near the entrance to SUB89 and there was no form of queue management system. The incident occurred inside the venue and on speaking to members of the public in the aftermath they have all stated that it was sparked by one of the bouncers from Treehouse who is called [REDACTED] (or similar) who is Albanian and has unnecessarily shouldered barged into a male and has demanded he move out of the way. There was a large disorder inside the property involving between 20 and 50 persons who were fighting on the dancefloor after taking a dislike to the bouncers. The bouncers have had to use a lot of force to remove parties from the venue. There was also mention that some form of tear gas may have been let off in the venue which resulted in members of the public coming out of the venue with red and watery eyes. All the persons involved in the disorder were removed and began to refuse to leave the area demanding that the bouncer who caused the issue come outside. During the period after the incident I witnessed the bouncer in question staring at the angry customers and aggravating the situation further. The incident at TREEHOUSE then sparked mass disorder in the town resulting in a male being run over, missiles being launched at police and multiple people trying to fight each other.

The staff were the potential aggressors initially but have then had to react to what was quite a violent and volatile situation involving approximately 50 persons inside the venue. They have managed to remove the main aggressors by force and then have had to react to the aggravated persons confronting them outside the venue. The main bouncer, who I know is from Portsmouth but I do not know his name, was professional throughout and liaised with police directly to see what his staff could do to help. The staff member who was at the centre of it, [REDACTED], did not help the situation in any way and was almost provoking the crowds through the window to the venue.

Police have had to assist at the door to the premises to prevent members of the public from getting into the venue and to protect the door staff. There were too many persons involved to issue section 35's, nor would it have been safe to get any kind of paperwork out as there were multiple males running at the doorstaff and trying to get at the doorstaff to show their aggression. Once all persons were removed from the venue it fell into police hands to try and disperse the crowds.

No arrests were made in direct response to the incident inside the venue due to lack of information/evidence and also due to the fact that 4 police officers were having to protect themselves and doorstaff from the aggressive behaviour of MOP.
